#### ONLINE

Courses can be taken online in one of two accelerated 8-week sessions (designated as session A and session B) or in one full-semester 16-week session. The same content is covered at varying paces, and the same amount of credit hours is earned for completion of a course in any of these venues.

### RESIDENTIAL

Courses can be taken on Toccoa Falls College's campus residentially for the full 16-week semester. Courses either meet on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays (M/W/F) for 50-minute periods or on Tuesdays and Thursdays (T/Th) for one-hour and 15 minute periods, with exception of lab hours. Participating Dual Enrolled students are not required to live in our Residence Halls.

#### **PREREQUISITES**

Courses with prerequisites—requiring transfer credit for or the completion of a previous course—are specified with an asterisk (\*). Please keep this in mind when selecting courses for Dual Enrollment.
